### The Music

**Spare Parts**—**David Kaynor** (fiddle) is well known for contra dance music & calling, but also has a secret love for playing English music. **Liz Stell** (flute) and **Bill Matthiesen** (piano) are talented and versatile dance musicians, playing everything from Civil War era tunes to tangos. All three appear on various recordings. Based in Western Massachusetts, the band is a regular at the Dance Flurry and has played for contra and English Country dances throughout the Northeast US and Canada.

### The Dance Leaders

**Pamela Goddard** and **Richard Sauvain** (long time teachers of English dancing in Ithaca and Rochester, respectively) will share calling for the Ball itself. Pamela (whose style demonstrations are always a treat) will teach the English Country Dance Style Workshop.
